During training sessions students will also use a number of our smaller consulting rooms as 'breakout' rooms for activities such as group work and skills practice sessions.




Therapy & Supervision Centers



How to Find Us



FROM THE SOUTH (A1) – Take the A184 (signed Gateshead and Newcastle). After one mile follow the A184 as it splits to the left and goes down to the Redheugh roundabout. Take the 3rd exit (right) towards Gateshead Town Centre, heading for the Tyne Bridge (A167M). Turn left onto the A167(M) and go over the Tyne Bridge. Follow this road until you reach the junction with A1058, signposted Jesmond and Tynemouth. Unusually you exit the A167(M) by bearing RIGHT onto the A1058. You then find yourself on Jesmond Road. Go straight over the traffic lights but keep in the left hand lane. Northern Guild is on the left before the Holiday Inn Hotel. You can turn left into a very small back road just before you see the Café Freudz sign in our window.

FROM THE NORTH (A1) – Take the A167 signed City Centre. Follow signs for A1058. After bearing left at the 4th roundabout you will pass exits to Gosforth before reaching A1058. Take the A1058: Northern Guild is on the left before the Holiday Inn Hotel.

FROM THE SOUTH (Tyne Tunnel A19)

Leave the tunnel (A19). Take the A1058 following signs for Newcastle City Centre, A167 and Jesmond. Stay on the A1058. Northern Guild is on the right after the Holiday Inn Hotel on Jesmond Road.

FROM THE WEST (A69)

Join the A1 going North then take the 2nd exit signed A167 City Centre. Follow directions as above (from North A1).

Parking

We have some free parking available to the rear of the building. We are a short walk away from Osborne Terrace car park (NE2 1NE), and ten minutes walk away from Haymarket NCP car park. Restricted on street parking is also available in the locality.

Public Transport

The Northern Guild is ideally placed for public transport links throughout the local and wider areas. We are very close to Jesmond Metro station - just a two minute walk - ideal for access to the Tyne & Wear Metro system which also provides direct access to transfers in the city centre, the central train station and the airport.

Accommodation

The Osborne Road area of Jesmond is well known for its abundance of hotels, guest houses and B&Bs. We are just a few doors up from the Holiday Inn Hotel on Jesmond Road, and a little further from Newcastle Youth Hostel, so finding something to suit your budget should be reasonably straightforward.
