



During the early stages of life our current identities were established, from birth to adolescence. Due to the impossibility of having all our needs met we grow on the outside while the child within us remains wounded.



These two days are intended for practitioners who are working with child or adult clients and who are keen to deepen their knowledge of the Primal Self.


During this specialist module, we will attempt to answer the question ‘What is the Primal Self?’


A three-part workshop designed for therapists interested in exploring the ways that sand play facilitates growth and healing and in expanding their repertoire of therapeutic tools incorporating sand play into their practices this practical workshop is an invaluable source.

Sand play utilises a tray of sand in which the client can rhythmically move, build, or create a scene using small objects – a non-verbal communication of their internal and external worlds.

The course entails a history and benefits of Sand tray work, and step by step instructions on how to conduct spontaneous and directed sand tray therapy sessions. This workshop is a good foundation for integrating sand play which will also stimulate the creative process because like the client, who sees internal and interpersonal dynamics and dilemmas the participant will find this workshop a powerful experiential tool that will reveal insights, information and paths to explore through experimenting and being part of their own and others in the workshop sand play creativity.

Enhancement of knowledge, skills and reflexivity in individual supervisory practice is the focal point of learning. This is experienced through consideration of a range of theoretical perspectives alongside practical sessions.

Creativity releases energy and allows flow and movement in supervision.

When we are in stuck places or can't find the words, the use of creative media facilitates spontaneity and connects both the supervisor and supervisee in an energetic process. This in turn can lead to more satisfying outcomes in the supervision and alleviates anxiety.

The first two days of the course will explore theoretical input, group discussion and experimental exercise. Day three will focus on supervised supervision.

This training forms part of the 10-day supervision training, which is a route to the Certificate and Diploma in Clinical Supervision.

Overview of the topic:

Malicious projections are an attack on moral goodness. They contain “... wicked or mischievous intentions or motives; are wrongful and done intentionally without just cause or excuse...”

This workshop will focus on understanding what happens to the supervisee when they are the focus of this kind of attack and on the approaches to working with the projections in order to understand the energy driving them and how to work with that energy.

The first two days of this course will explore theoretical input, group discussion and experiential exercise. Day three will focus on supervised supervision.
